

CHILD SAFE POLICY

We want children who participate in Street Library Australia's events to have a safe and happy experience. We support and respect children and their families as well as our paid staff and volunteers.

Title	Street Library Australia - Child Safe Policy
Introduction	This policy guides paid staff and volunteer Street Librarians on what to do when interacting with children. The policy focuses on how we can build and maintain a child safe environment which is inclusive, transparent and promotes children's participation.
	Our organisation supports the active participation of children in the events and activities that we offer. We recognise children have a right to provide feedback or raise concerns.
Children's Participation	We listen to their views, respect what they say and involve them when we make decisions, especially about matters that will directly affect them.
	All children under the age of 15 years must be accompanied by a Parent or Guardian at all events related to Street Library organisation or volunteer Street Librarians
Paid Staff and Volunteer Street Librarian Code of Conduct	Volunteer Street Librarians are requested to:
	 (a) confirm attendance by an adult or guardian of any child under 15 year at the commencement of any event; and (b) ensure they are not alone in an area separate from other event participants when interacting with any children under the age of 18 years.

Recruitment: Paid Staff	Our organisation will maintain a consistent screening and selection process. All paid staff must provide a current Working With Children Check.
Complaints Management and Reporting	Members of the public may raise concerns and bring complaints to Street Library Australia directly by contacting our Child Safety Support Officer/General Manager, Mel Lake on <u>mel@streetlibrary.org.au</u> or Ph. 02 8405 7942. Any concerns about actual or possible risk of significant harm to a child can be reported to the NSW Government using the Office of the Children's Guardian <u>Reportable Conduct Scheme</u> .
Support for volunteer Street Librarians	All new volunteer Street Librarians will receive a copy of these child safe policies and procedures.Queries on the policies are to be directed to Child Safety Support Officer/General Manager, Mel Lake on <u>mel@streetlibrary.org.au</u> or Ph. 02 8405 7942. Child safety is a standing agenda item at meetings and volunteer Street Librarians are encouraged to ask questions and contribute to the continuous improvement of child safe policies, procedures and practices in the workplace.
Communication	Street Library Australia will hold information sessions for paid staff and volunteer Street Librarians as needed. Our policy will be discussed during induction sessions for all new paid staff and volunteer Street Librarians. Children and parents joining our events will receive a copy of this document upon registration.
Review	The policy and guidelines will be reviewed every two years and incorporate comments and suggestions from our range of stakeholders (including workers, children and families). Our first review will take place on 1/10/2025.
